

2. JOHN ROSS WRITES: -<u>WHY WE BELIEVE JESUS ROSE FROM THE DEAD</u>

If Jesus did not rise from the dead, the Christian faith is a foolish fantasy. However, if the resurrection of Jesus did occur, it confirms his life, message and atoning work. It is the basis of our hope of life beyond the grave. Jesus is Alive and the evidence is overwhelming.

Here are some of the reasons we can be so sure.

1. Jesus predicted his resurrection (Matt 16:21; Mark 9:9-10; John 2:18-22)

2. The Old Testament prophesied it (Ps 16:10;compare Acts 2:25-31;13:33-37)

3. The tomb was empty and the grave clothes vacant.

If those who opposed Jesus wished to silence his disciples, all they had to do was produce a body but they could not. (John 20:3-9)

4. Many people saw the resurrected Jesus. They looked on his face, touched him, heard his voice and saw him eat. (Matt. 28:16-20; Luke 24:13-39; John 20;11-29; John 21:1-9; Acts 1:6-11; ! Cor. 15:3-8)

5. The lives of the disciples were dramatically changed. Though they fled and even denied Jesus at the time of his arrest, they later feared no one in their proclamation of the risen Jesus. (Matt.26:56, 69-75)

6. The resurrection was the central message of the early church.


The church grew with an unwavering conviction that Jesus had risen and was the Lord of the church. (Acts 4:33; 5:30-32; Rom. 5:24)

7. Men and women today testify that the power of the risen Jesus has transformed their lives.

We know that Jesus is alive not only because of the historical and biblical evidence but also because he has miraculously touched our lives.

Week commencing 26 April: Pray for our Queen and Government. Pray for wisdom in decision-making. Also pray for integrity and humility.






He also enjoys improvising and was able to help out with some of the carols at the Crib Service at St Paul's in December.

You search in all the likely and the unlikely places you can think of, but without avail. You begin to feel irritated at the amount of time wasted in searching.

If it is something valuable or important, you have a sick feeling in the stomach. So what are you to do in such a situation ? **The answer lies in prayer.**



It may not seem right to you to ask God to help you

to find something you have lost, but the Lord is always willing to help those 'troubled in spirit'. in the words of the hymn "Take it to the Lord in prayer". Remember what Jesus said, "Seek and ye shall find",

"Ask and ye shall receive", "Knock and it shall be opened unto you."

Some time ago I mislaid an important document. After looking everywhere without success and getting irritable in the process, I prayed to God, asking him to help me find the document. After praying earnestly for a few moments. I suddenly felt that the problem had been solved, or rather, that I need no longer worry. The next morning I had occasion to open a drawer in my bureau. It had jammed, and on pulling it out to see what was the cause, I found the missing document lodged at the back between two drawers !

On another occasion I lost my cheque book. I searched high and low at home, but without avail. So I prayed to the Lord that it would be returned to me. I was so worried I couldn't sleep and got up during the night to look in another place. But it wasn't there.

Although I had prayed to God, I was still worried, and reported the loss to my bank, who cancelled the unused cheques and issued me with a new book. Later that day I was looking through a file dealing with photography, and there was my missing cheque book. I must have left it there after writing a cheque to a processing firm. I felt such a fool when I informed the bank, who rescinded the cancellation order. Had I have had more faith in my prayer and waited a day or two, I would have been spared this ignomy.

Since then I have frequently prayed to God to help me in my search for missing objects, and having prayed, have ceased worrying. And in due course, the objects have been found.

The secret of taking your troubles to God in prayer is that you must have faith and leave the matter in His hands. To continue to worry shows lack of faith. And it is by faith that prayers are answered.

NEWS OF BERYL BAKER Len & Eileen Hollingsworth

Since the 1960s Beryl Baker has worked in Paraguay as a missionary/nurse. A native of Thirlmere Road, Barnehurst, and one-time member of St.Paul's Youth Fellowship, she can certainly be described as "one of St.Paul's own", and proof that our missionary work has practical aspects.

Her newsletters are marked by a reticence to describe her own achievements, an account of the welfare of the animal life for which she provides sanctuary, and some details of the medical and spiritual welfare of people over an area the size of Kent. Accordingly, we have decided to visit Beryl in Paraguay this summer. What has at last persuaded us, after 40 years of friendship with Beryl and as air travel becomes ever more dangerous, to undertake the 17-hour flight to Asuncion, the capital, where Beryl is based?

We have a realisation that Beryl cannot continue this work for ever, and that it is necessary to see her work at first hand to think how her work could best be carried on. For this reason we're thrilled that we will be able to go to the Chaco area (no problems of navigation – there's only one road, the Trans-Chaco Highway), and even to accompany her to her patients. We will stay in her home in the Chaco, reassured that the crocodile in the pond in her garden is said to be more frightened of humans than we are of it! We will also visit the Iguacu Falls and great Itaupu Dam on the borders with Brazil and Argentina. This "adventure" will go some way to compensate for the rather "couch potato" nature of travel by air.

There are many who have been interested in Beryl's work and we will be happy to learn from them what they need to know further, before our visit. There will certainly be a report on our return.



16. <u>NEWS FROM LOKKI IN SRI LANKA –</u> <u>BUT DO NOT MENTION THE CRICKET!</u> Len Hollingsworth

News of England's third-worst cricket defeat, against Sri Lanka, will nevertheless have come as good news to the inhabitants of the unfortunate island.

The Sinhalese pre-occupation with cricket can best be explained by saying that the name of Murali has the same effect on the whole population in the Island that the name of Beckham has on the younger population here. If there is a Mrs. Murali, perhaps she is also famous for being a member of the Spice (Island) Girls.

The crisis that Sri Lanka has endured for the last few months follows the extra-ordinary decision to suspend Parliament and reject the peace proposals with the Tamils. This civil war has endured for more than 20 years, killed over 65,000 people, and at one stage strangled the tourist industry which was so important to the gentle majority of the people of Sri Lanka. In particular, 50 churches have been attacked, property, books and Bibles have been destroyed, and people attacked by anarchists who want to increase the political instability. Lokki himself remains unhurt and says that the attacks have been justified by the accusations that Christians have been converted by unethical means. To his knowledge, not one such accusation has been substantiated, but, as he says, if a lie is repeated often enough, it will become accepted as truth.

Despite all this, at his church there have been 31 baptisms this year and recently the Bishop confirmed 28 people. Now Lokki, as the Venerable Lokhendra Abhayaratne, resides in Galle, at the southern tip of the Island and has found it very helpful to have a driver for the countless trips to Colombo This journey, of a little over 100 miles, can often take more than four hours. It passes through an endless succession of seaside resorts along the South-West coast, none of which has been built with the needs of longdistance travel in mind.

18. THE NEW GROUP LOGO

Our last magazine referred to this new Scout logo, designed by Bill. Edith Rose thought it would be good to encourage Bill to let us know more !

THE SHIP - The Henry Grace a Dieu, was an English warship commissioned during Henry VIII's reign and named after him. A contemporary of the Mary Rose, named after the king's favourite sister. The Great Harry was even larger. Built on the old carrick style with a large fore and stern castles, she was 165 feet long and weighed around 1000 tons. Built locally between 1512 & 1514, she was one of the first vessels to have gun ports allowing her to fire broadside. In 1539-40, she was extensively remodelled, as she was the Mary Rose, to increase her firepower and manoeuvrability. She appears to have been more of a diplomatic vessel, sailing on occasion with sails of gold cloth.

THE SHIELD

is based on the Erith Borough Council Arms which has been 1910 the basis of our group badge for many years. The three pikes or 'lucies' portray the areas connection with Sir Richard de Luci, Lord of the Manor of Lesness in the 12th Century. In 1178 he founded Lesness Abbey whose arms are also lucies and afterwards he was Canon regular there. The fleur-de-lys, also known as the fleur-de-luce, is a further play on the name Luci. The fleur-de-lys in the group Scout Badge has been altered to portray the universal Scout Emblem. The white horse on a red background is from the arms of Kent County Council. PREPARE Its position on the shield shows Erith's location in the NW of the county.

THE SCOUT LOGO incorporates :

The 2nd Erith Scout Group the name and number of the group.

The group started in <u>1910</u> and is one of the longest continuous running groups of the twentieth century, having been temporarily disbanded only during the war years.

The <u>Shield</u> which is our *Group Badge*, is the Erith Borough Council Arms with the fleur-de-lys changed to the *Scout Emblem*.

The Scout Motto is Be Prepared.


The '2nd Erith Scout Group has a long tradition and is an organisation of which we are justifiably proud.

" I know son," replied the old man. "But that flashing neon sign, 'Toot 'n Tell or Go to Hell', can't stay on the church roof ! "






